Ngā Tatauranga Māori Māori Workforce Data

The following data provides a high-level view of trends in the total Māori labour force and employment. It will be updated as the results of the last census are released. Currently, Māori employees make up 14% of the Manufacturing workforce, 10% of Engineering and 17% of Logistics.





Māori population in 2023 was **887,500** projected to increase to **1,068,100** by 2033.

Māori labour force participation in 2023 is **69%**



In 2023, **29%** of Māori were employed in high-skilled jobs and **46%** in low-skilled jobs.

The growth rate between 2013 – 2023 for highly-skilled employment was **55%** compared to **36%** for low-skilled.



In 2023, **6,930** Māori learners were enrolled in manufacturing, engineering or logistics VET qualifications.

The top two occupation groups for Māori workforce are professionals **72,127** The next largest group is labourers at **69,840**.
